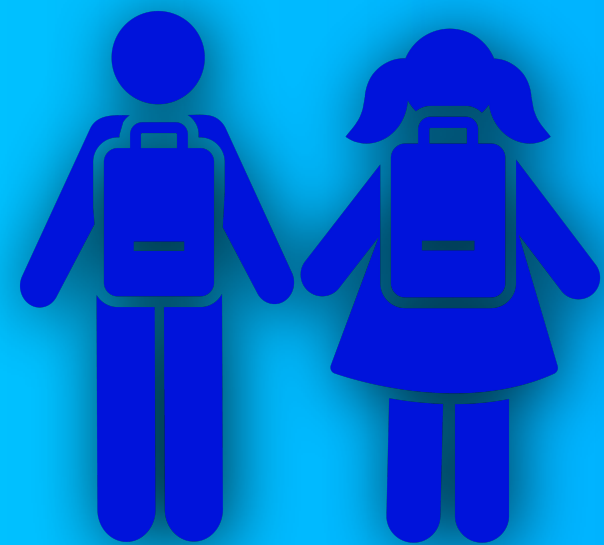


World Children's Day



General facts:

- Every country follows these rights except for America.
- Every child has rights



These are the rights you have

Article 28

every child has the right to education, requiring that primary education be compulsory and free, and secondary education be available in different forms to all children

Article 17

gives children the right to
access information from various
sources, including the media,
that promotes their well-being

Article 24

establishes a child's right to the highest attainable standard of health. This includes the right to access healthcare services, clean water, nutritious food, and a clean environment.

Article 12

establishes a child's right to express their views freely in all matters affecting them and to have those views given "due weight" according to their age and maturity. This means children have the right to be heard and taken seriously.

Article 19

governments must protect kids from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect, and bad treatment by parents or other caregivers. This includes both physical and mental harm, and governments are required to take all necessary legal, administrative, and social measures to ensure this protection and to provide support when harm does occur.

Article 31

the right to rest, leisure, play, and to participate in cultural and artistic activities. For kids, this means they have the right to have fun, relax, and engage in activities like sports, games, and the arts appropriate to their age

Article 29

a child's education should help them fully develop their personality, talents, and abilities, and encourage respect for human rights, their own culture, and the environment. It also aims to prepare children for a responsible life in a free society by teaching them about peace

Article 2

all children have these rights without any discrimination, no matter their race, colour, gender, language, looks religion, political or other opinion, national, ethnic, or social origin, property, disability, birth, or other status.

Article 15

every child has the right to freedom of association, meaning they can meet with other children and join or set up groups and organizations.
