What are Children's Rights?

Children's Rights are the things every child needs to grow up safe, healthy and happy.

They are written in a special agreement called the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

The ABCDE of Children's Rights

A – Rights are for ALL children (UNIVERSAL)

B – Rights are there at BIRTH (INHERENT)

C – Rights CANNOT be taken away (INALIENABLE)

D – Rights DO NOT have to be earnt (UNCONDITIONAL)

E – All rights are EQUALLY important (INDIVISIBLE)

**Rights are for
ALL Children
(UNIVERSAL)**

Every child, everywhere in the world, has the same rights — no matter who they are, where they live, or what they believe.



B

**Rights are
there at BIRTH
(INHERENT)**

You are born with your rights. You don't have to do anything to get them — they belong to you from the very start of your life.



C

**Rights CANNOT
be taken away
(INALIENABLE)**

No one can take your rights away — not adults, not governments, not anyone. They are yours forever.

**Rights DO NOT
have to be earnt
(UNCONDITIONAL)**

You don't have to earn your rights by behaving in a certain way. Every child deserves them, always.

All rights are
EQUALLY
important
(INDIVISIBLE)

Every right matters just as much as the others — the right to learn, to play, to be safe, to be healthy, to have a voice.
