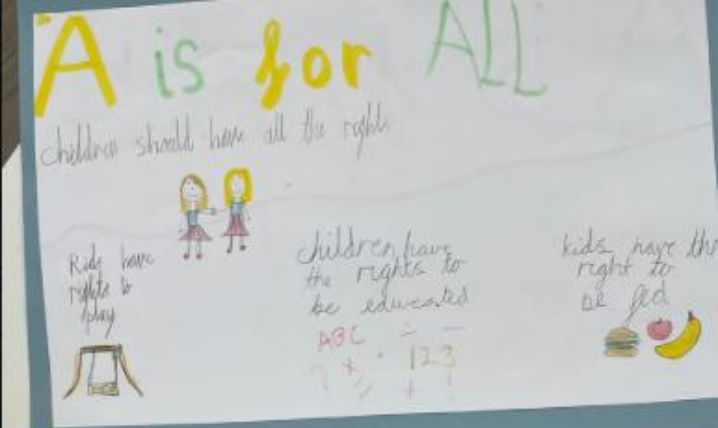


Focus on the Rights – I have a Right to play, I have a Right to meet with friends– draw a picture of you playing with your friends.

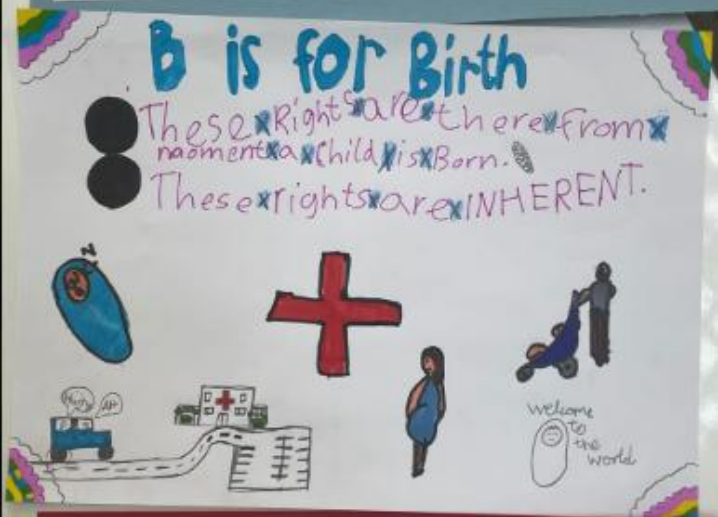
Activities we can do in school – P2

Learn the difference between a want and a need using the picture cards, discuss these in a group with your teacher.

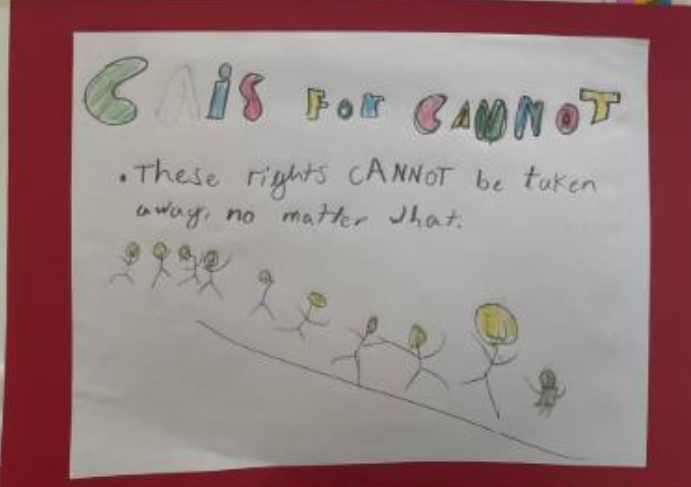
Poster competition – Create a poster for our ABCDE wall display – choose 1 of the letters to represent
